Broad-Based Outcomes Projected for 2007-08 Mini-Grant Program

Over the coming fiscal year, both the PACD Chesapeake Bay and Nonpoint Source Pollution (Section 319) mini-grant programs are aiming for broad-based outcomes. In order to assess our effectiveness with these strategies, we will be reporting on data sets including, but not limited to, the following:

- Number of people reached in target audience
- Number of people reached in broader community
- Number of workshops / meetings conducted
- Number of tours / field days / walkabouts held
- Number of educational materials distributed
- Number of pollution reduction tools, such as rain barrels, distributed
- Percent of audience with increased knowledge of Chesapeake Bay / local watershed(s)
- Percent of audience with increased knowledge of nonpoint source pollution and everyday strategies to reduce / prevent nps pollution
- Percent of audience who installs BMPs (stormwater, such as rain barrels; agriculture, such as no-till/cover crops; AMD, etc.)
- Overall percentage of audience taking action to improve watersheds / reduce nonpoint source pollution as a direct result of project activities
